



Minor Consent to Treat

I understand that under Alaska law, A.S. 25.20.025, minor patients have the right to consent to their own medical care in the following circumstances:

- The minor is living apart from the minor's parents or legal guardian and is managing the minor's own financial affairs, regardless of the source or extent of income
- The parent or legal guardian of the minor cannot be contacted or, if contacted, is unwilling either to grant or withhold consent
- The minor is seeking diagnosis, prevent, or treatment of a pregnancy
- The minor is seeking diagnosis or treatment of a sexually transmitted infection/disease
- The minor is a parent of a child and may give consent to medical services for the minor child.

I further understand that where a minor seeks care on their own behalf, parents and/or guardians generally do not have a right of access to information relating to such care for the above circumstances only.

I understand that I may be held financially responsible for any balance incurred and will provide accurate billing information as applicable.
